



DEMENTIA CARE Framework

To be at the forefront of providing eldercare services, THKNH believes in providing person-centred and evidencebased care for our elderly clients. With a total of 114 beds dedicated to serving patients with dementia in 2 of our wards, and with many general elderly patients also being diagnosed with dementia, it is key for our care framework to be well-informed by interactions of various dimensions of dementia.

Dependent on the dimensions of dementia stages, cognitive decline and behavioural states, as the stage advances, stress thresholds of our elderly clients decline and normative behaviours will be greatly reduced progressively while anxious and dysfunctional behaviours begin to increase. Many internal and external factors may contribute to stress in elderlies with dementia. Therefore, the organisation has built a care framework guided by the Progressively Lowered Stress Threshold model (PLST). This care framework will guide our strategy geared towards eliminating the key issues of isolation, boredom, loneliness and despair, commonly faced by the elderly in their sunset years. With a focus on the 5 identified key areas, supported by empirical evidence, the care team can then plan interventions accordingly to achieve the necessary patient, caregiver, as well as institutional outcomes.

The Organisation regularly reviews and manages its reserves to ensure optimal capital structure, taking into consideration the future capital requirements of the organisation and fund efficiency, prevailing and projected profitability, projected operating cash flows and projected capital expenditures.

- iii. Competitive bids or comparable valuation are to be obtained; and
- iv. The Audit Committee has determined that the transaction is in the best interest of the Organisation though there may be a conflict of interest.

RESIDENTIAL CARE

THK Nursing Home @ Hougang serves up to 285 residents who require nursing care, including up to 114 clients living with dementia. We believe in providing the best quality of life for those in institutional care. To do that, the Nursing Home considers all psychosocial, physical, medical and emotional aspects of our clients. We do our best to create a tranquil, person-centred and safe environment for them.

The Nursing Home features amenities such as therapy gardens, a rehabilitative room, sensory rooms and other elder-friendly infrastructure. Two levels of the building are dedicated to the care of patients living with dementia. Our dementia wards are specifically designed for dementia care. Coupled with evidence-based dementia programmes such as sensory rooms and other innovative technological solutions, the facility strives to provide a Home away from Home for the residents.

THK Senior Care Centre @ Kaki Bukit provides care for up to 80 seniors during the day, offering the following range of step-down care services:

- Dementia Day Care serves clients diagnosed with dementia, providing supportive care that will help slow down the deterioration of their physical and mental health

- Home-care services like Home Medical and Home Nursing services are also offered to elderly clients in the ٠ community, providing holistic care in their own homes in the community









As 1 of the 4 providers of subsidized home care in Singapore, our Interim-Care Service strives to relieve the hospital's 'bed crunch' and reintegrate patients back into their own homes.

Clients who are not suitable for or are unable to access Community-based services may benefit from our Home Care services.

We provide frail and homebound clients with Home Personal **Care** consisting of personal hygiene care, some help with housekeeping, and mind-stimulation activities.

Home Medical & Home Nursing under the Home Health Programme will support those who require medical or nursing care due to various chronic or terminal illnesses.





We thank PCF Sparkletots for this collaboration which brings joy and fun to our seniors.



HEART - "Home Enhanced Art Reminiscence Therapy" Programme

The HEART Programme uses actual art paintings to engage our RWDs. Working with Artualize Gallery, these art paintings include portraits and scenes that were specially curated for the purpose of aiding reminiscence.

These art paintings provide a whole new dimension of contextualisation that can be interpreted differently by individuals.

Through the use of art paintings, we have successfully bridged the connection with our RWDs and in turn helped to elevate their well-being and quality of life.

Engaging residents in portrait puzzles provides an opportunity for them to recruit the use of multiple visuospatial cognitive abilities.

THKNH's New Garden of the HEART

THKNH has had long-term plans to revamp the garden with more interactive features and sensory elements.

The Oasis Garden of the Heart is a purpose-built dementia-friendly garden incorporating our Progressively Lowered Stress Threshold (PLST) model of care. A walk through the oasis garden will provide our residents with a full multi-sensory experience.

The garden also incorporates therapeutic horticulture, which uses gardening or plant-based activities to improve the physical and psychosocial wellbeing for our residents. It is also designed to create conducive pockets of space surrounded by natural vegetation and amenities to offer residents, visitors and staff a comfortable environment to rest, relax and socialise, just like a home away from home.

The new garden is curated into 5 zones, based on the types of features and according to the intensity of the types of activities (both passive and active)

Each zone incorporates various elements that can fulfill the various needs of all visitors.



This programme went on to win The Best Dementia Care Programme Award at the 11th Eldercare Innovation Awards.



Harvest@SCC project


One afternoon in March 2022, one senior in our Maintenance Day Care Centre showed us some edible seeds that she had received from NParks. Holding the seeds in her palm, she asked our staff if she could plant these seeds in the centre as she attends daycare daily. Two seniors heard her question and joined in the conversation and they started chatting happily about how they enjoyed gardening but are unable to do so now. This inspired the SCC team to source for senior-friendly planters that are suitable for our daycare centre. We purchased several VegePods and began our Harvest@SCC project!

Music Making Programme

Since post-COVID, I'm Soul Inc's music-making programme was launched and had achieved significant results in enhancing the physical and social well-being of the residents. The programme's main objective was to engage the residents in music-making activities, and it has successfully achieved its objective. We saw positive outcomes such as:

- 1. Its effectiveness in promoting physical activity among the residents, which improved their overall health.
- 2. It has enabled the residents to follow the rhythm and make music, helping the residents to develop new skills and has boosted their confidence in their abilities.
- 3. It has encouraged social engagement and teamwork among the residents.
- 4. The program has created an enjoyable environment for the residents.

In December 2022, during the staff Christmas party, the residents performed for the staff. Staff members clapped along during the performance by the residents, evoking an environment of encouragement and support for them as they performed.

THKNH Smart (Google) Glasses

Through this project, we are showcasing how innovative technology can be up-purposed to supercharge the work of caregiving, and help improve the lives of elderly people in a holistic manner. With the use of Google Glass, we can provide a better life to our clients who have been staying at home due to their physical mobility or due to their preferences given the ongoing Covid pandemic.

This initiative provides Virtual Tours to engage and enthuse our clients' cognition as well as Home Nursing and Home Medical Video consultations to have regular follow-ups on their physical well-being.

Dementia, Music & Me

We have the right to be recognised as who we are, to make choices about our lives that comprises of taking risks and contributing to our society. Our diagnosis should not define us nor should we be ashamed of it.

Thye Hua Kwan Nursing Home (THKNH) is an eldercare facility equipped with 285 beds; in this organization we are constantly thinking of ways to keep our residents engaged and delighted.

285 different people with varying needs and functional abilities.

Of particular challenge, are the residents with dementia.

Research shows that music therapy can improve a resident's mood especially for those stricken by dementia. Music is universal – everyone can listen and participate in its soulful magical elements including the care staff.

We gathered those with musical talent to sing to the residents while going on with our daily assigned tasks. We also encourage residents to listen to their favorite music and have even organised impromptu karaoke sessions for those who have a penchant for singing to showcase their hidden talents.

Since we had experienced a measurable amount of success, we began paying attention to the type of music that works best for dementia patients and individualised the kind of music we play for them.

We discovered that songs with special meaning to them improved residents' moods. The process of speaking to the residents to find out more about their music-related preferences has become another chance for us to engage them, thereby facilitating in improving their ability to communicate and even lowering their dependence on pharmacological therapies.

Being the amateurs we are, we rarely hit the right notes. But what I hear is the joy in the residents' voices, and witness the smile it brings to their faces - these are the characteristics that liven up our nursing home.

Overseas Singaporeans, nursing home residents welcome changes to make voting easier for them

SINGAPORE - Musician See Chee-Hang, 36, has not voted since 2011 because his nearest polling station is an eight-hour drive away and it is difficult for him to get time off work to travel there.

Mr See, who lives and works in Charleston, South Carolina, in the United States, is among the Singaporeans living overseas who will be able to vote by post in the 2023 ential Election, after new laws were passed by Parlia

Before, Mr See – who is also a music teacher – would have to take a day or two off work to go to Washington to vote, a situation made more difficult by the time difference between Singapore and the US, which meant Polling Day usually landed on a weekday for him, making it harder to take leave.

He said: "I'm confident that postal voting will go without a hitch."

Before the changes, overseas voters had to travel to polling stations in specified places to vote, a situation that resulted in some Singaporeans being unable to vote when Covid-19 travel restrictions set in across the globe in 2020.

At GE2020, there were 6,570 registered overseas voters, and 4,794 of them cas their ballots, About 200,000 Singaporeans are living overseas

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





THKNH's future plans

In 2025, THKNH will begin operations of our 2nd nursing home at Tanjong Katong.

THKNH also has several projects planned that will address the most important needs in our organisation:
